6.1. Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures

Personal precautions: Refer to section 8 of SDS for personal protection details. If outside do not approach from downwind. If outside keep bystanders upwind and away from danger point. Mark out the contaminated area with signs and prevent access to unauthorised personnel. Turn leaking containers leak-side up to prevent the escape of liquid. Avoid breathing vapours, mist or gas. Ensure adequate ventilation. Beware of vapours accumulating to form explosive concentrations. Vapours can accumulate in low areas. Eliminate all sources of ignition. Remove sources of ignition. The accumulation in low lying or closed rooms can cause increased danger of fire and explosion. The vapour of the product is heavier than air and may accumulate below ground level in pits, channels & basements in higher concentrations.
