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

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### AC operation

Before operation please ensure voltage on the set corresponds to voltage of your local area. Unravel AC line cord; insert one end into AC jack on the set and the other end into a standard AC outlet.

### **Battery operation**

Disconnect AC cord set completely. Open the battery door and insert 8 x UM-2/" C" size batteries (not supplied) making sure the indicated battery polarity is observed.

Remove all batteries if the unit will not be used for several months or more.

### **Radio operation**

Slide Function switch to "radio" position and Band switch to the desired waveband.

Turn the Tuning knob to your desired radio station.

Adjust sound level by rotating Volume control knob.

To turn off radio, simply slide function switch to OFF position.

### FM stereo indicator

When tuned to a FM stereo broadcast the FM stereo LED indicator will light up. In weak signal areas where FM stereo signal may not be strong enough and can cause excessive background noise. In this case, slide the Band switch to FM position.

### Antenna

For best reception, fully extend FM Antenna.

### Bass boost

To increase bass at all volume levels, press the bass boost button to "ON" position to boost the low frequency tone for an emphasized bass sound. To release super bass, simply slide the button to "OFF" position.

### Stereo headphone jack

For private listening, insert the plug of a stereo headphone into stereo headphone jack and adjust the volume control knob accordingly. During the use of a headphone, speakers are automatically disconnected.

### Auxiliary (AUX) Mode

Slide Function switch to "AUX" position.

Connect the earphone socket from an Auxiliary unit (e.g. MP3 Player or MD Player) into Aux-In jack on the rear of this product via an Audio Line Cord (3.5mm plug on both ends; not supplied).Play the Auxiliary unit. Music from Auxiliary unit can be listened through speaker of this product.

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# Playing compact disc (CD-R/RW Playback compatible):

### **Getting started**

Pull up the CD door. Put a CD disc into CD Compartment and close the door. Set the Function Switch to CD position.

Ensure CD door is closed properly and locked in place.

When CD door is closed with a disc inside, total number of the tracks will be shown on CD LCD display and go to stop mode. (Eg: Total 17 tracks inside the disc). The "DISC" indicator will always be shown on LCD display.

Should skipping of tracks occur during CD playing, try reducing the volume.

When CD is playing, do not open CD door.

If there has no disc inside, LCD display will show NO and go to stop mode.

If CD door is not closed, LCD display will show ---.

### Play/Pause mode

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When **PLAY/PAUSE** button is pressed during CD stop mode, first track will be played. The Play indicator and specific number of track being played will be shown on LCD display.

For interruption while CD is playing, press CD **PLAY/PAUSE** button once. The Play indicator will blink continuously on LCD display.

Though the sound stops, the disc will continue to spin. To restart playback, press CD **PLAY/PAUSE** button again, music will start from the exact position where it was interrupted.

To stop CD playback, press CD Stop button once whether CD is in Play or Pause mode; LCD display will show total track number of the disc.

### Skip and search mode

During play or pause mode, when **d skip/SEARCH FORWARD or BACKWARD** BUTTON is pressed once, it will go to next track or go back to the beginning of the track.

During play mode, when **cd skip/Search forward** or **Backward button** is pressed and held, it will search the track with audible high-speed forward or backward playback.

### **Repeat mode**

Repeat once:

During CD play mode, press CD mode button once, repeat indicator **REP** will be shown on LCD display. This single track of music will be repeated.

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Play Indicator First Track







Track 8 is to be repeated



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Repeat all:

When CD MODE button is pressed twice, repeat all indicator will be shown on LCD Display. The whole disc can be played continuously.

To cancel repeat function press CD mode button repeatedly until repeat indicator disappears from LCD display.

Random play mode:

This feature allows tracks on the disc to be played in a random order.

During CD stop mode, press CD mode button three times. **RANDOM** indicator will be shown on LCD display and all music will be played in random order automatically.

To cancel random play function, press CD mode button again, **RANDOM** indicator will disappear from LCD display.

### Program mode

During CD stop mode, press Program button once. The PROGRAM indicator and number of Program to be memorized starts from the first program **P01** will light up and blink continuously.

Press cd skip/search forward or backward button to your desired musical track, LCD display will show this appropriate track number. Press the program button to store this track in memory.

Repeat above procedure until all desired tracks have been programmed. A total of 20 tracks can be stored into memory.

Whenever CD skip/search forward or backward button is pressed, it will always show the last programmed track first to recall your memory.

After complete programming, LCD DISPLAY will show PROGRAM and flash continuously.

Press cd play/pause button once to start program playback; CD Play indicator will

light up.

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### Example: Album # 3. Track # 2

To check the program you have stored after complete programming, press program button once during CD stop mode; LCD display will show P01 and blink continuously.

Track#2

PROGRAM

DISC

Press FOLDER BUTTON to read album number; press CD skip/search forward or backward button to read the specific track number of said album.

Press program button again, LCD display will show P02 and blink continuously. Repeat above procedure to check all programs being stored.

To cancel programmed memory:

During CD stop mode, press CD stop button once OR Open CD Door during CD stop mode.

The **PROGRAM** indicator will disappear from LCD DISPLAY.

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












### Playing MP3 DISC

Getting Started:

Note: Should skipping of tracks occur during MP3 Disc playing, try reduce the volume.

When MP3 disc is playing, do not open CD Door.

Pull up the CD door. Put a MP3 disc into CD compartment and close the door. Set the Function switch to "CD" position.

Note: Ensure CD DOOR is closed properly and locked in place.

When CD DOOR is closed with a MP3 disc inside, total track number in the disc will be shown on LCD DISPLAY and go to stop mode.

The DISC indicator will always be shown on LCD display.

If there has no disc inside, LCD display will show **NO** and go to stop mode.

If CD door is not closed, LCD display will show ---.

### Play/Pause mode

When PLAY/PAUSE BUTTON is pressed during CD stop mode, the first track will be played. The Play indicator will be lighted while **MP3** indicator will be shown as well to indicate MP3 disc is being played; LCD display will show the specific track number is being played.

To select specific musical track inside MP3 disc.

MP3 music can be stored into CD disc with or without folder according to your MP3 burning method.

If MP3 disc is downloaded without dividing into folder, all track number will be shown directly in the LCD display. The Album number will only show after pressing **FOLDER BUTTON**.

If music is stored into different folders, you have to select the specific Album number first by pressing FOLDER BUTTON; afterwards press CD SKIP/SEARCH FORWARD or BACKWARD BUTTON to select the specific track number inside this Album.

Example: To select Album # 4, track # 3

STEP - 1: Press FOLDER BUTTON to select Album # 4

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No. 68 Tracks













STEP - 2: Press CD SKIP/SEARCH FORWARD or BACKWARD BUTTON to select

Track # 3 inside this Album # 4

For interruption while MP3 disc is playing press CD PLAY/PAUSE BUTTON once. The Play indicator will blink continuously on LCD display.

Though the sound stops, the disc will continue to spin. To re-start playback, press CD PLAY/PAUSE BUTTON once again; music will start from the exact position where it was interrupted.

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To stop MP3 disc playback, press CD STOP BUTTON once whether MP3 disc is in Play or Pause mode.

To turn off the unit, slide FUNCTION SWITCH to OFF position.

### **USB** operation

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This unit supports most of the common MP3 interfaces.

Slide Function switch to CD position.

Press CD/USB button once, LCD display will show USB indicator.

When there is no MP3 Player or Flash drive connected to USB port, LCD display will show **NO**.

Insert USB plug of an auxiliary unit (e.g.: Portable MP3 Player or Flash Drive) into USB port in this unit, total number of music will be shown on LCD display.

Press CD play/pause button to start playing the music.

Operate all CD control buttons same as above mentioned in section **PLAYING MP3 DISC** they have same function and operational method.

To exit from USB playback mode, press CD/USB button again. It will go back to CD disc mode again.

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### Warning:

The power cable/disconnect device should remain easy to access and disconnect.

When you are not going to use the unit for a long period of time, disconnect AC power cord. Where the mains plug or an appliance coupler is used as disconnecting device, the disconnecting device should remain operable.

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In case of malfunction due to electrostatic discharge (ESD), reset the unit by reconnecting AC cord again to resume to normal operation.

When not in use - Unplug the AC power cord completely from AC socket.

The excessive sound pressure from earphones/headphones (not supplied) can cause hearing loss/damage.

To prevent fire or shock hazard, do not expose the appliance to rain or moisture. Do not remove cover; pilot lamps soldered in place.

No user serviceable parts inside; refer servicing to qualified service personnel.

Do not place the unit in closed bookcases or racks without proper ventilation. Keep minimum distant (5 cm) around the apparatus for sufficient ventilation:

The ventilation should not be impeded by covering the ventilation openings with item such as newspapers, tablecloths, curtains, etc.

Never put the unit in direct sunlight or near to any heat sources.

No naked flame sources, such as lighted candle, should be placed on the unit.

The apparatus shall not be exposed to dripping or splashing. No object filled with liquid, such as vase, shall be placed on the apparatus.

If the product is not to be used for a long period of time, remove the batteries from the product and the remote control (where applicable) to avoid battery leakage.

The batteries shall not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire or the like.

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
### Warranty
